ENTRANCE/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:					
(Programs of four hundred fifty (450) or more clock hours or the credit hour equivalent shall administer a basic skills examination to each student who enrolls, unless the student has provided evidence of a high school graduation diploma, general equivalency diploma, or its equivalent.)					
Applicants for this program must comply with the following admission requirements:					
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Present a valid picture ID. • Be 18 years of age, (17 years with parental consent, or emancipated), United States citizen, or eligible non-citizen. • Complete an application for admissions. • Provide evidence of completion of U.S. high school diploma or GED (General Equivalency Diploma). If received from a foreign institution the applicant must present the corresponding translation and evaluation. • Proof of English proficiency (for non-native English speakers only). • Successfully complete an interview with the Director of Education. • Students must have a minimum HESI A2 composite score of 65 to apply for admission to the program. • A picture ID is required to take the exam. Cost: \$50 (non-refundable; payment can be made by cash or credit card). Length of the test: Approximately 4 hours. Maximum number of times the exam may be taken is 2 (\$50.00 each time). Applicants that obtained low scores for both tests may retake after six months. For more information about the exam, please visit www.evolve.elsevier.com • Physical (including TB Testing) - Students are required to have had a recent physical and received all required testing by an approved Physician or ARNP stating he/she is in good health and free off communicable diseases. The approximate cost is \$100. The cost for TB testing may be greater if X-rays are required. • Electronic Fingerprinting (Background Check Level II) - Students are required to submit an electronic copy of his/hers fingerprints as part of the admission requirements. Approximate cost is \$80 • Submit 2 letters of reference. One of the references should be academic or employment related. Family members may not complete a reference letter.

The Practical Nursing program is designed to prepare the students to be part of the healthcare team, to teach the students how to provide quality care to the patient, to provide the theoretical knowledge and clinical instruction necessary, to offer quality and affordable education and to prepare students to provide nursing care tin assisted living facilities, hospices, physicians' offices, hospitals and home healthcare. Upon completion of the Practical Nursing program, graduates will be prepared to sit for the NCLEX-PN examination in order to achieve licensure as a Practical					

Nurse. Graduates who have earned a license will be able to seek employment as Practical Nurses in in assisted living facilities, hospices, physician offices, and home healthcare.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Practical Nursing program provides students the knowledge and practical experience to work as a Practical Nurse. The curriculum includes legal and ethical responsibilities, communication and interpersonal skills, administrative and clinical duties, healthcare concepts, emergency procedures including CPR, safety and security procedures, medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, pharmacology, geriatric, pediatric, maternal/newborn nursing and medical-surgical nursing. Classroom and clinical experiences are incorporated into the curriculum.
